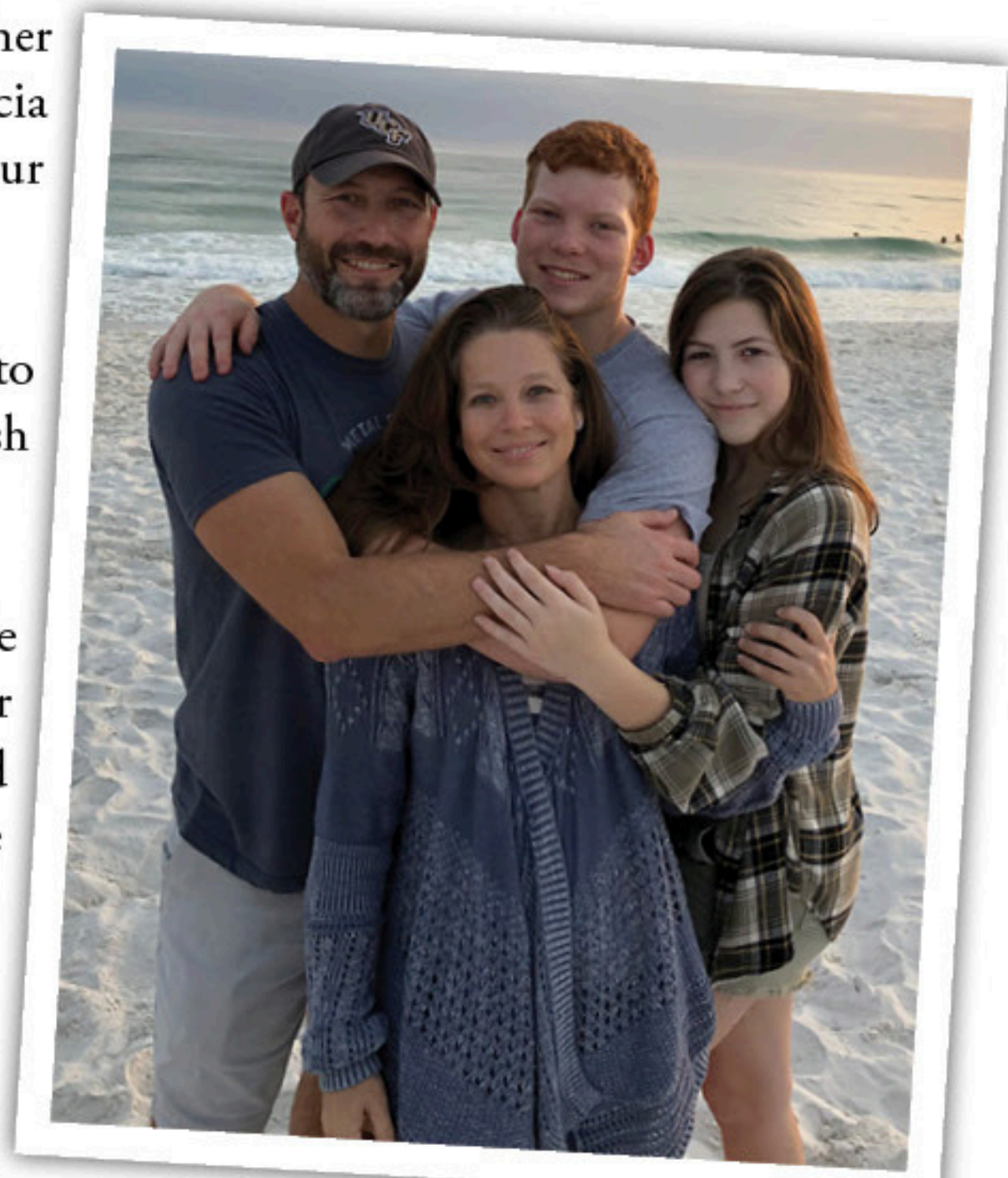

Inspired by the thriving educational journey of their niece and nephew, Todd’s brother Clay and his wife Alicia chose Charlotte Prep without hesitation for their own children. Alicia, too, has become an invaluable asset to Charlotte Prep, witnessing her children blossom into confident and independent students. Clay and Alicia eagerly anticipate watching Ryker and Avery grow into leaders within our community, carrying forward the torch lit by their older cousins.

Stories like the Rebols echo throughout our school, and it’s a privilege to witness family traditions continue to flourish. We at Charlotte Prep cherish these narratives as they embody the heart and soul of our community.

Last year, during this time, our school community achieved a remarkable milestone. With the help of the “Landsberg 33” Challenge, we raised over \$200,000, which allowed us to complete the much-anticipated track and field project, as well as gave us a head start on the reconstruction of the pavilion destroyed by Hurricane Ian. Construction of the new pavilion is slated to be finished before the summer break. As promised, the new pavilion will be nearly doubled in size, making it much more practical for student and parent usage. With the rising cost of construction, the pavilion bid came in higher than expected, and your 2023 end-of-the-year giving will enable us to get it completed.



We have already seen that the track and field has had a positive impact on our students, enhancing their physical fitness, sportsmanship, and overall well-being. This year, we are excited to continue our journey of progress and can already envision the continued impact the pavilion will have on our school family.
